We have interviewed ten candidates to date and, as you will see, we are meeting a further minister at the end of the month. Please pray for us as we do so and also for Waterlooville who will begin their search for a minister this month.

SPURGEON'S COLLEGE – It is an honour to have become a Governor and I have done so at a time of considerable challenge. The Government's newly established Office for Students has refused to grant registration to the College and so during August we had to have an emergency Governors' Meeting. There are no problems at all with the teaching of the College but there were anxieties about the College's financial sustainability. As a Governing body we are convinced that the College is financially sound and that the OfS decision was based upon an incorrect understanding of our finances. The College can continue to teach but the OfS decision prevents students from accessing student finance which is obviously a key issue. Please pray for us as we mount a legal challenge to the OfS decision and as we seek to find a way through this difficulty.
