1 YEAR ON...

Last Sunday marked one year since we packed all our belongings into a big yellow lorry and moved from Great Yarmouth to Newbury.

This also means it's almost a year since Claire's car conked out, both the girls caught chicken pox and the manse boiler broke! However, despite those relatively minor hiccups, as I look back upon my first year as Minister, what stands out to me is God's faithfulness.

We knew and expected life would be very different, and it certainly has been. But this has almost entirely been positive, with the Lord providing for each of my family in different ways, as we have sought to make friendships and settle into work, school and nursery. Being part of a minister's family can be a strange and sometimes disruptive experience, yet God has shown that when he calls, he also provides - and that promise is just as true for the girls as it has been for me.



Soon after I arrived in Newbury, someone from NBC shared a verse with me which they felt God had put on their heart. It was Colossians 2:2, which says: "My purpose is that they may be

encouraged in heart and united in love, so that they may have the full riches of complete understanding, in order that they may know the mystery of God, namely Christ."

It's a verse which chimed with one of the core things which I believe God has called me to express in my ministry; namely seeking to encourage foundations of a loving church family, united by our shared faith in Jesus, so that in turn we might encounter God in deeper and more transformative ways.

I think there remains a sense that God is very much at work in NBC. We've seen it through dedications, baptisms and members stepping out in faith to serve God locally and abroad. We see it in the quiet conversations and invitations to join and foster community. We take joy at the sight of dozens of children charging out to their classes every Sunday; each one being nurtured in their young faith.

Of course we are far from being a perfect people.

We are a work in progress.
But it's a genuine privilege
to share in that journey with
you, and exciting to see
where our faithful God is
leading us.

May he continue to bless you, and our church.
