DARK NIGHTS; BRIGHT LIGHTS

Somehow we've already reached October! How has that happened? I'm sure the Summer holidays only started a couple of weeks ago!

Time marches on, and we move into a month where the nights really start to draw in, and things get noticeably darker. So it's a good job October is also the month of our Light Party, hence the neon theme to the Weekly News.

If you haven't registered your child yet, then I urge you to do so - it's one of the highlights of the year, and a brilliant, positive alternative to Halloween. It's also the perfect event for your children to invite their friends along.

This month we are also giving thanks for our oldest musical instrument; the organ, with a special Songs of Praise style service on Saturday 12th.

It is perhaps apt that in a month of seasonal change, we say goodbye to something which has provided a focal point for Sunday worship for many decades, but in recent times has found itself used far less often, as worship styles and the availability and skillset of musicians has changed.

We will all have our own opinions and preferences when it comes to the choice of hymns and the way they are played and sung; this is nothing new in church life!

The use of instruments, namely the organ, was a controversial topic following the reformation in the 16th

Century, as early protestants sought to distinguish themselves from Roman Catholic worship.

Even the great 19th Century Baptist preacher Charles Spurgeon did not want an organ in his church, viewing it as a distraction, and preferring songs sung a cappella. (I dread to think what he'd have made of drums, guitars, mixing desks and big screens!)

There is also a rich history of congregations complaining about new songs! One famous letter to a pastor reads: "What is wrong with the inspiring hymns with which we grew up? When I go to church it is to worship God, not be distracted with learning a new hymn. Last Sunday's was particularly unnerving. The tune was un-singable and the new harmonies were quite distorting."

The letter was written in 1890. The hymn? "What A Friend We Have in Jesus."

It is probably a good thing that the Bible does not give us instruction on what style or instruments to use in worship. Culture has always influenced practice and style, and culture is always changing. The challenge is navigating through this in a way which encourages all to seek Jesus first and foremost. Thankfully we have a team of excellent musicians and thoughtful worship leaders to help us at NBC.

In times of change, it can be comforting to know that those who have gone before us have also experienced similar feelings. And as with the changing seasons, through it all, God remains faithful, and his promises remain unchanged.

Set up will take place after the service on Sunday morning and will involve stacking the chairs at the side of the church and setting up some tables, chairs and mats ready for Friday morning. Preparing the church for Sunday will only involve putting the chairs back in the correct rows. This could be done any time between Friday lunchtime or Saturday evening depending on availability, and we can arrange access to the church if necessary.
