PREPARING YOUR HEART FOR CHRISTMAS

With just one week to go, how prepared are you?

Presents all brought and wrapped?

Turkey ordered?

Cards written and sent?

Heart MOT completed?

Hang on...Heart MOT?! What on earth is that, I hear you say. And what's it got to do with my Christmas preparations?

In a nutshell, it's about asking ourselves whether our focus has shifted too far onto the 'doing' of Christmas preparation, at the expense of engaging in any spiritual preparation?

In his book *Do Nothing Christmas Is Coming*, Stephen Cottrell writes: "Christmas is one of the most joyful times of the year. It is also one of the most stressful. It is laden with expectations. It It is often overtaken with grief...It might be the season of good will, but it feels like the last straw on an already overburdened camel."

The season of Advent, as separate to Christmas, is all about waiting and preparing for the coming messiah. But often our preparations are consumed by practicalities, and the space for Jesus is left at a minimum.

It's why I invite you to carry out your own 'heart MOT'.

For those of you with a car, you'll know your annual MOT is meant to check that all the key parts of the car are working, and that it's safe to drive.

If you've only got 3 wheels and the brakes don't work, you know it's going to fail the test and you won't be able to drive it legally. Change is required!

At the same time, car MOTs will also flag up 'advisories'. These are things which aren't performing as well as they should, but are not serious enough to require an immediate change.

Claire's car flagged up a minor issue with its exhaust at its MOT in August. It turns out it wasn't quite as minor as we were told, because the exhaust box fell off last weekend. Not the sort of early Christmas present we were after...

A heart MOT is about taking time to metaphorically get out of the driving seat and take a look at our lives.

Are we reaching Christmas low on fuel, with deflated tyres and a faulty clutch, so we can't seem to change gear?

In reflecting upon the coming of Jesus to the world, is God flagging up some spiritual advisories which are worth noting?

The good news about Christmas is that God enters into the mess of the world, and the messiness of our lives.

Like a good mechanic, God roles up his sleeves and is willing to get oil on his overalls, grease on his hands, and has the right tools to mend whatever is broken.

The famous prophetic words of Isaiah 9 promise a messiah who will be a 'Wonderful Counsellor', a 'Mighty God', an 'Everlasting Father' and the 'Prince of Peace'.

Jesus fulfils each of these titles, and perhaps by taking the time to reflect upon them over the coming week, we might not only get a diagnostic report for our heart MOT, but see how God might carry out the repairs we need.

As this will be the last Weekly News of 2024, I want to take the opportunity to thank you for all your encouragement and fellowship in my first full year as Minister at NBC.

It's been a busy year, with lots of change and lots of activity. I remain thankful for the many ways in which God is at work, especially through the dozens of committed volunteers who serve faithfully across the church, and I am excited about what the Lord will do in 2025 and beyond.

On behalf of myself, Claire, Mia and Coco, we wish you a peaceful and joyful Christmas, and a happy and hopeful 2025.

When we visited you earlier this year, we shared the song "Way Back Home" with you. We're excited to share a new song, "Stable Beginnings" (listen here), which reflects on the humble and hope-filled origins of the greatest story ever told—Jesus' birth in a stable. It's a reminder of God's plan to bring hope and redemption through the most unexpected of circumstances.

Wishing you a Christmas filled with joy, peace, and the hope that Jesus brings. Thank you for walking with us – we couldn't do this without you!

Advent God, as we count down the days until Christmas, we recognise that this special time of year looks very different to Christians across the world. We helped our mission team from Trujillo Baptist Seminary to prepare for their second trip this year to teach the Awahun community in Kuyumatak. Dave wrote some teaching material about the ministry of the church in the community and the power of personal testimony. The team are pictured below. Their names (from left to right) are Emil, Yuniled, Horacio, Jenny and Nilton.

Please pray for the team to stay healthy during their time away, and that the Holy Spirit will enable them to be effective in their teaching, evangelism and ministry among the wonderful Pastors, women and children.

In our final week before travelling to England, we visited Chiclayo again, both taught at Emmanuel Church and stayed with Pastor Fernando and his young family.



This is our fifth Home Assignment. It's good to be back again! Seeing family and friends again is such a delight, though the cold is always a shock to the system, as it requires a determined mindset to swing those legs over and leave the warm and comfy duvet in the chilly mornings. Nevertheless, we press on with a smile in the strength that God always provides.

Our son Jonathan's baptism this month is a significant milestone for which we are so thankful. Our faithful God has drawn another one even closer to His heart. This is amazing.

Looking back over the year, we are grateful for the many mercies we have been shown by our gracious God. We have good health, the ministry of BMS continues to move forward in small steps with an even greater emphasis on strengthening what our Peruvian sisters and brothers are doing, and we look forward to a favourable year ahead.

We recently secured some funding for a missions fair organised by our Seminary for the region of La Libertad which will take place in a few weeks' time. At that time, many churches will gather to play sports together, share food, pray and raise money for missions trips to share the good news of Jesus and teach the bible.

The Peruvian Baptist Convention has also recently sent a couple, Francesco and Lili Quispe, to Sao Paolo Brazil to plant a church there among a diaspora group. Would you pray for them as they start off? For favour with the people, good health, stamina, perseverance and good fruit.

We are planning for 4 weekends of training to take place in 2025 at the Nauta Integral Mission Training Centre, with all of them to be supported by local funding and teachers.



Pastor Pepe Flores (pictured in the middle with Dave and a visiting missionary from France called Michael) from the Baptist Convention has also proposed a water filtration project that has the potential to financially support local and national mission. We pray this great idea will develop into a strong pillar for kingdom work here.

The pastors in Loreto are still in need of great prayer support and visits to encourage them in their service to the Lord as they are often pessimistic about their ministry.

'No, dear brothers and sisters, I am still not all I should be, but I am focusing all my energies on this one thing: Forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead, I strain to reach the end of the race and receive the prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us up to heaven.'
