The Power of Our Thoughts



We all know that social media works on algorithms - they react to a variety of data, including behaviour, interactions & interests to match content to audiences with similar preferences.

The idea is that it shows users more of what they are interested in. This is fine if you like watching videos of kittens, but not great if you prefer some of the darker things the internet has to offer.

The more morally corrupt, unethical or unpleasant the material, the more likely that the algorithms will direct you towards more of the same. There is a parallel to be drawn with our own thoughts & what we expose ourselves to in our downtime. What we spend our time thinking about can affect our emotions, our actions & our characters.

The bible gives us an insight into the importance of keeping a check on our thoughts. In Isaiah 26:3 it says that God will keep our hearts in perfect peace if we keep our minds fixed on Him.

In Philippians 4:8-9 Paul tells us, "finally brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable - if anything is excellent or praiseworthy - think about such things. Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me - put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you."

The more time we spend focusing our thoughts on God and His Word, the more our hearts will be kept in peace. Peace is available to those who consistently trust in God, and fix their thoughts on Him. It doesn't stop life from being challenging or problems from arising, but it changes our reaction & perspective to them.

How many of your thoughts are spent on things relating to God? Do you keep your mind focused on Him when you're feeling anxious or stressed? Are there some simple ways you can continue to remind yourself to think about God throughout your day? Perhaps starting a daily devotional App or a commitment to read a chapter of the Bible each day, or identifying a trigger that you can use as a reminder to talk to God or say a prayer of thanks.

Spend some time thinking about the power of your own thoughts and the access you've been given to God through Scripture. Perhaps you could commit in 2025 to building the habit of centering your thoughts on God so that you can know Him more and experience His perfect peace.
