

Hidden Names & Stored Treasures

I have a slightly nerdy confession to tell you: I find church history really interesting!

I realise I might be in the minority, but I enjoy learning about the stories behind a church, and the way God has worked through different people at different times. Joining a church like NBC is particularly fascinating because we can trace our roots back to 1640, which ranks us among the earliest Baptist churches in the UK.

Of course, almost everything about the church has changed (several times) since then, and we are in the middle of further changes to our building. Some have been in membership for many decades and can remember many of the changes to have happened. But I wonder if even our longest-serving member (who reached 70 years in membership earlier this month!) would know the names A. Hayward and F. Palmer.

They were two men whose role at NBC had been largely forgotten for almost 85 years, until the pulpit was removed earlier this week. A hidden piece of wood was discovered with their names on, dated July 3rd 1940 - an old piece of graffiti from the carpenters who made and installed the pulpit.

The legacy of their work was to enable the faithful preaching of God's word for almost a century. And rather aptly, the focus of their work was not for their names to be brandished boldly for all to see, but on the name of Jesus. It reminded me of Jesus' words in Matthew 6:19-21: "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven."

All worldly things will eventually come to pass. But the things we store up in heaven will not. These 'riches' are accumulated through devotion to God, good works and acts of kindness. What treasures are you storing up? Jesus goes on to say "for where your treasure is, your heart will be also." A test of one's heart is a good way of working out what kind of treasure we have been storing.

Of course, whatever we have done in the past need not define our future. Every day we can choose devotion to God. To do good works. To seek opportunities for kindness. What kind of treasure will you store in the coming weeks, months and years?

Loving God, we pray for our church family and those in particular need at this time. We think especially of those who are grieving, and ask that you comfort and shelter them.


We pray for those who are struggling with their health, and pray particularly for healing for Beryl in hospital. May you remind those who are struggling that you are faithful, and grant them your peace.
