

## Old Words; Fresh Meaning?

On Sunday, as part of our service, we said the Lord's Prayer. Many of you will react saying "nothing unusual in that" and in many ways I agree.

However, as a numbers person let me show how this is not always the case across the generations.

When I was growing up, it was the normal practice for school assembly to be a Christian based service, ending with the Lord's Prayer. As I was at boarding school, this meant 6 days a week, but with two school chapel services on a Sunday, it means I heard and said the prayer 8 times a week.

By my calculations, when I left school, I had been exposed to these words over 3,500 times. Then in the 80's and 90's it was still normal to repeat the Lord's Prayer at every Sunday service. So, I think it's fair to say I have racked up a total of at least 4,000 readings.

There is no single written document that I have had so much exposure to, or ever will have: I know each "thou" and "art" and every cadence. For me, updating the words feels like putting on a slightly stiff pair of new shoes, rather than a pair of old comfy slippers. I am sure this experience is not unusual in my age bracket.

Contrast this experience with today's generation. A few months ago, we said the Lord's Prayer before the children and young people left. I know of one who didn't know the words and commented afterwards that it felt like we all 'went into a trance' and started 'chanting stuff'. The Lord's Prayer was new and unknown to them.

Over the decades, School and church life have changed dramatically, as demonstrated by this response.

My reflection is that we don't become complacent. For those of us for whom the Lord's Prayer is familiar, the challenge is to approach it as something fresh and new every morning, whilst also understanding that our experience is not replicated across the generations.


