

Church Meetings: Lamborghini or Lada

Usain Bolt. Fibre Broadband. A Lamborghini Aventador.

What do these things have in common? Speed! Whether it's a sprinter, your wifi connection, or a supercar; all are geared towards speed. The faster the better!

Our world today is generally geared towards speed. *Fast* food, same-day delivery, the speed at which VAR makes its next calamitous intervention at the expense of Arsenal's title charge...!

But faster doesn't always mean better.

From slow cooking beef brisket to considering a significant decision in your life; sometimes it pays to take your time.

Last night (Tuesday) myself, Neal and Steve attended the launch of a new set of resources called *Slow Wisdom*. This is the title of a book based on the recent doctoral research of a Baptist Minister, Ruth Moriarty. It explores the way Baptist churches listen to God together, and discern the mind of Christ in Church Meetings.

One of her key findings is the need for churches to practice what she calls *slow wisdom*. She defines this as a process of "embodied Christian practical wisdom, characterised by prayer, listening to each other and God, and exemplified in the best practice of small group work."

It was interesting to listen to her presentation and the panel discussion which followed, particularly in light of our own practice of discernment and use of the Church Meeting. One of the observations made was the place of "gut instinct" - or what Moriarty calls "the divine gut"! When you listen carefully, do you ever get a sense of a gut reaction to whether something is 'right' or not? Is this something you bring into your participation in Church Meetings?

Finding 100% consensus is difficult, if not impossible sometimes. The challenge of listening to God, to ourselves and to each other is something is also difficult, but one we *can* commit to doing. It requires us to slow down, often listen before speaking, and being brave in sharing when we do have something to say. It also requires careful consideration of how we structure Church Meetings, and how space is created to encourage and develop that kind of culture.

As a diaconate we are committed to finding ways to do this, but would value your input and ideas. How do we make spaces to hear voices on the margins? How do we better include families who often miss out on Church Meetings due to childcare? To listen to God well is a goal worth striving for, and I hope something we can increasingly do well as a church.
