Kyrie Eleison: A prayer for all

Kyrie Eleison. Lord Have Mercy . Christe Eleison. Christ Have Mercy.

On Sunday we sang those words as part of a prayerful response to the third anniversary of the war in Ukraine, and the ongoing conflicts and tension which engulf our world.

The Greek words are lifted straight from the New Testament, where they feature regularly. Whether it is the tax collector in Luke 18, the Canaanite woman in Matthew 15, or the blind men in Matthew 20; the words *Lord, have mercy,* are a plea to Jesus from the desperate, the sinful, and the humble. And they have continued to be uttered by Christians ever since.

In a similar way to how the Psalms have often been used as foundations for our sung worship, this prayer has offered a model for us, especially when we are unsure what else to pray. The scale of events like war, inequality and injustice can seem far too great for us to comprehend, and consequently we can sometimes feel a little lost in where to even begin. *Kyrie Eleison* offers us a starting point.

Perhaps it is no surprise that this prayer has been adapted many times into sung form. The fact it has been sung across the globe in vastly diverse cultures and contexts is testament to its power. These are not words which "belong" to the Catholic or Orthodox traditions, nor do they belong to Hillsong, Bethel or any other popular contemporary musicians. These are words which belong to the Church. The universal body of Christ.

What this means is that these are words which belong to you.

They are a prayer resource which you can pick up, mull over, whisper quietly or sing loudly.

Words which can cause us to sink to our knees in repentance, or cast our hands upwards in a plea for the broken and needy of the world.

In the evangelical tradition which many of us come from, there can be a tendency to "do away" with pre-scripted prayers, under some misguided notion that they are in some way less Spirit-filled than the ones you might come up with on the spot.

Yet I'd like to encourage you to lean into prayers like *Kyrie Eleison*; for these are words which are drenched in 2000 years of reaching out to God and longing for him to respond through his Spirit. They find their roots in the direct encounters people had with Christ, and they can focus our minds upon seeking a fresh encounter with him today. They can be the starting point and the ending of our intercessions and our confessions. May we know the power of *kyrie eleison*.
