

### **Baptist Together Week of Prayer Invitation**

As a church we are members of Baptists Together - the national union of Baptist churches, colleges and regional associations. However, we tend to generally focus on our own church, and maybe the work of churches together in Newbury (CTNA), rather than what it means to belong to a regional or national group of Baptists.

But our roots as a church go all the way back to 1640, putting us among the oldest Baptist churches in the UK. Our current membership includes a former General Secretary of the Baptist Union, and the current General Secretary's PA. So we are quite well-connected!

Fill us with the hope of resurrection, even as we walk through the shadows of this Lenten season.


We pray this prayer in the name of Jesus, amen.
