What are our responsibilities as members of NBC?

It's a tricky question to answer, as there are a lot of moving parts, meaning there's unlikely to be a one-size-fits-all response. A lot depends on what stage of life we are at, demands on our time from work and family, as well as health concerns and limitations.

But I think it's a question worth reflecting on from time to time.

There are some obvious answers which we would probably turn to first: Praying for the work of the church and for one another; attendance at Sunday worship and Church Meetings; giving to God, both in our time and financially; living lives in accordance with Christian values and the teachings of Jesus. These are actually all set out in our constitution (section 12:3 to be precise!)

But there are other, less obvious responsibilities, which are perhaps harder to pin down, but can have a huge impact on the culture of the church, as well as revealing the maturity of our faith.

One such example is if and how we 'hold spaces' for others. This concept finds its roots in Isaiah 54:2, which says: "Enlarge the place of your tent, stretch your tent curtains wide, do not hold back; lengthen your cords, strengthen your stakes."

In the passage God is talking to Israel as they prepare to return from exile. It is a call to trust in God for growth and development, as well as a call for Israel to prepare to change what it knows and remembers from before the exile. It finds parallels in Ephesians 2, where Paul reminds the church that in Christ, the promises God makes to the Jews are extended to include the gentiles.

In our own context, we might want to reflect upon what it means to trust in the work God is doing, so that we are "enlarging the place of our tent", so others may know and worship God.

For example, what does it mean to be generous gatekeepers of the church? Does our behaviour collectively and individually encourage an open place for all to belong, or a closed place, belonging only to a few? The common feedback of NBC being a welcoming place to visit is a good sign!

I love the idea that as we grow in our faith, we increasingly reflect the generosity of God in how we encourage newcomers and make space for those younger in their faith to 'find their feet' in how and where they serve God. I have always been grateful for the example and encouragement of others further along in their journey of faith, as well as their grace when I inevitably made (and make!) mistakes. It's a beautiful picture of the family of God at work, growing together.

Who are you 'holding spaces' for? What does it look like to be a responsible member of NBC at this point in your life? May God bless you as you reflect upon those questions this week.
