

Reflections on Holy Week

Only a few days ago we celebrated Palm Sunday, and reflected upon the expectations the crowd had upon Jesus as he entered Jerusalem, as well as our own expectations of Jesus today. When do our expectations align with God's plan and promises? When do they differ?

Holy Week tends to go a little quiet after that, and only starts to build momentum again on Wednesday (Today). This is the point in the gospels where Judas agrees to betray Jesus. In some Christian traditions it's known as *Spy Wednesday*, which I think adds to the drama.

Judas' actions stand in stark contrast to those of the woman who anoints Jesus with expensive perfume in the home of Simon the Leper. I don't think it's a coincidence that Matthew weaves these stories alongside each other in his gospel account (ch 26). They highlight the growing tensions around following Christ and not only understanding his teachings, but embracing and following them.

"When the disciples saw this, they were indignant," writes Matthew (26:8). If I stop and think about how I'd feel if I was one of those disciples, indignant at someone worshipping Jesus, I'm embarrassed and ashamed. Yet how often do I misunderstand what Jesus is trying to teach me, while dismissing others because they worship and engage with Christ differently? The truth is probably more often than I'd care to admit.

I think there is a fear among many Christians of not wanting our faith to cause us to stand out or do anything which might draw attention to ourselves. Of course, some of this is perfectly reasonable and understandable. Our natural characters and dispositions. The culture of the church we attend. Perhaps negative experiences in the past.

But as we engage with the various characters and their actions in Holy Week, I think it's remarkable that the few whose actions are commended by Jesus are the ones willing to stand up and stick out. The woman with the expensive perfume. The women at the foot of the cross. The criminal who professes faith in Christ whilst crucified alongside him. In contrast, those who maybe should've known better - namely the disciples - are repeatedly found wanting. Then there is the crowd, whose fickleness ultimately condemns the man they had celebrated days earlier.

This isn't necessarily a call to more charismatic expressions of worship, or dramatic displays of faith. But it is a reminder that the difference between these two groups is that one had their eyes completely fixed upon Jesus, and didn't allow the fear of being different or standing out to stop them engaging with him, and in turn having their faith strengthened and rewarded.

May we keep our eyes firmly fixed on Christ over these next few days.
