

Small Groups: A Big Deal

Throughout May we will be using this space in our weekly news to think about Small Groups, and the key role they place in helping us grow as disciples of Jesus. We start today with a reflection from Julie, our deacon responsible for small groups. Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing.

1Thessalonians 5:11

This verse in Thessalonians encourages Christians to actively support and strengthen each other. In a large congregation it can be difficult to do this, however, small groups create opportunities to build relationships which go beyond those of a Sunday morning.

Small groups spend time studying the Bible, praying together and supporting each other in practical ways (they also enjoy a good social too!). They help to nurture spiritual growth as it is easier to ask questions and dive more deeply into a Bible passage or topic. Meeting regularly with others helps to build relationships and for members to feel comfortable to share more personally with one another, it also helps to remind members that they are not alone in their faith journey. For all of us life has its challenges but being part of a small group means you have others who are with you through the good times and the more difficult times.

Small groups have been a part of NBC for many years and I have been in several different groups during my time here. At NBC we have a mix of different small groups: some which meet during the day, others in the evening; some in person and others online or a mixture of both; some at church and others in the homes of members.

In an increasingly disconnected world, small groups offer a space for connection, growth and support. Whether you are seeking deeper biblical understanding, meaningful relationships or simply a place to belong joining a small group can help to transform your Christian life.
