

# **Small Groups: A Leader's Perspective**

This month our focus is upon Small Groups. Each week in May we will hear from different people about their experiences of being part of a small group and the benefits they have found from belonging to one. We are a small group of around 12 members who meet fortnightly on a Monday evening, alternating in-person or on zoom. We study the bible and spend time praying, for topics related to the study but also for things going on in our lives. We've studied a mixture of things over the past year, from books of the bible to topical themes that direct us to various bible passages.

We're currently looking at biblical masculinity and what it means to be a man of God in today's culture – one that we're all interested to study (whether we are male or female) as we become increasingly aware of some of the challenges (young) men face today, particularly online.

Leading a small group has been hugely beneficial for both our personal relationship with God and our relationships with other members of NBC. We have busy family and work lives, which means we generally pick studies that don't require a huge amount of preparation (and have good leaders' notes we can refer to!). Our approach has always been that we're not there to 'teach' members of the group or have all the answers, but to help initiate and guide thoughtful, biblical discussions that help others consider their own journeys of faith and understanding. If we waited until we had 'sufficient' knowledge or time to lead a small group, we would never get started!

We also have a passion for building community through small group. We encourage thoughtful conversations about the bible and our faith, but we also want to build strong relationships and a sense of community where we can support each other through life's ups and downs. We arrange a bring-and-share lunch once a term after the Sunday service as a chance to catch up with each other. Our last session of the Christmas and summer terms are usually a social evening of games, or wine and cheese. We hope that we can help members of our small group feel part of a community here at NBC, one that is there for the fun times, but also the harder times, standing alongside one another in prayer, fellowship and faith.

### **Venturers Camp Reflections**

What do you get if you bring together nine yachts, 40+ young people, seven days of sunshine, half a tonne of cake and the occasional change of pants?

The answers: the Venturers Norfolk Broads Cruise 2025!

Ten young people from NBC joined the Cruise at Easter this year, including two for the first time and two in leadership roles. They enjoyed a week of living, sleeping and sailing on traditional Broads yachts alongside a crew of teenagers, with an adult (Skipper) coming aboard each day.

Venturers was established 78 years ago to introduce young people to sailing, the Norfolk Broads and the Christian faith – and it's changed very little since its founding. (Young people are now allowed to wear socks).

So the NBC teens were up at 7am every morning to clean the yachts ready for inspection, followed by breakfast on board. They also have a morning Bible study with their crew, exploring faith with people of different ages and various backgrounds.

We sail during the day, stopping for rowing and dinghy sailing regattas where crews compete against one another. Ask the teenagers about the Martham Bell trophy and who came out on top this year!

We moor for dinner on board, and evenings were spent in the local church or village hall. There's a crazy mix of fun and games, before a time of worship and a talk about faith. This year's theme was 'God's got this', and young people heard how God is always with us, even when it might not seem so, and wants us to be part of His plan.

It was a great, adventurous, fun and exhilarating week, with so many prayers answered. Thank you if you prayed, and please ask the Ignite young people about their highlights of Venturers 2025. And if you want to know more about the Cruise, speak to Kev Smith (the Commodore) or Claire.
