MONTH OF PRAYER

During July we've had a month of prayer, getting out & praying over the streets where we live, our neighbours & communities. We've run four prayer walks, praying over Newbury and going where the Holy Spirit has led us. During these walks an option to "stay & pray" at church has also been offered, with prayers being prompted by the information on the posters in the welcome area, maps of Newbury & newspapers reporting local news.

The prayer walks have covered a lot of ground and places that have received our attention include the train station, local parks, schools, council offices and other churches.

Some of the recurring themes centred on:

- those in power who make decisions affecting residents. We pray that the welfare of those they serve remains at the forefront of their minds. We pray for wisdom and discernment for them as they use their positions to protect the vulnerable, use funds wisely and promote ethical values.
- those arriving in Newbury (whether by train or other means). We pray that they would find meaningful relationships, a sense of community and the opportunity to hear the Gospel. We pray that NBC & other local churches would be welcoming places where people can develop their faith.

- the public spaces we can use. We thank God for his creation and the outdoor spaces that have been

 summer. We pray that they would be safe spaces, where positive relationships flourish and a sense of
 community formed.
