

Anticipating God With Us

We're halfway through the second week of Advent, and it would appear the church is gripped by Narnia fever!

A number of you have told me that you're either reading *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe*, or have watched the film to remind you of the story, as we continue our journey through Christmas in Narnia. We've already covered the themes of hope and peace, both of which have brought challenge and reassurance. This Sunday we will be thinking about joy, and I'll be ably assisted by the acting skills of Bright Sparks and Lightning Squad. It's one not to be missed!

One of the themes which runs through the book is the power of names, particularly that of Aslan, the lion. Even the mention of it brings fear to the witch and her cronies, and hope to the creatures living under her oppressive rule. The anticipated arrival of Jesus is also marked by the revelation of names. We read in Matthew 1 that an angel tells Joseph to name the baby Jesus "because he will save people from their sins." Just two verses later (v23), we read he will also be called *Immanuel*, which means "God with us."
